James Dailey is scheduled to be executed on November 7 at 6:00 p.m. Dailey, who was sentenced to death for the 1985 murder of 14-year-old Shelly Boggio, has a strong case for innocence.


The eight Catholic bishops of Florida have [written to Gov. Ron DeSantis](#) urging him to stay the execution. "While we urge you to stop every execution and end the use of the death penalty in Florida, this case of a veteran with evidence of innocence is especially alarming," wrote the bishops.

Another man, Jack Pearcy, has signed a sworn affidavit that he, and he alone, was responsible for the tragic death of Shelly Boggio. No physical evidence ties James Dailey to the crime; however, the Florida Supreme Court refuses to allow him to present new evidence proving his factual innocence.

The violent murder of Shelly Boggio cries out for justice. However, taking a life to punish and teach that killing is wrong perpetuates violence, is unnecessary, and would only further the tremendous harm that has been done. The direct killing of the innocent is always wrong and an intrinsic evil.

If carried out, this will be the 100th execution in Florida since the reinstatement of the death penalty in the 1970s. This is the third death warrant signed by Gov. DeSantis.

100th Execution or 30th Exoneration?

James Dailey is set to be executed November 7th. He is probably innocent. Urge Gov. DeSantis to Halt the Execution!

No eyewitness testimony or No physical evidence connects him to the murder. According to FBI forensics testimony, **the physical evidence excludes him**. He was convicted only on circumstantial evidence and unreliable and discredited hearsay testimony from jailhouse snitches.

The actual killer has repeatedly confessed to being solely responsible and is serving a life sentence for the crime.

Another U.S. Military Veteran put to death by Florida? James Dailey is an honorably discharged Vietnam War Vet who served three tours and one in Korea. His execution would be just four days before we honor our veterans on Veteran's Day.

ANY doubt is TOO MUCH DOUBT in Florida. If Dailey is put to death, it would be the **100TH FLORIDA EXECUTION** since executions restarted in the 1970's while there have been **29 INNOCENT PEOPLE EXONERATED** and released from Florida's Death Row - nearly **ONE exoneration for every THREE executions.**

James Dailey granted stay of execution until Dec. 30

The U.S. District Court for the Middle District of Florida has granted a temporary stay of execution to allow Mr. Dailey's newly appointed federal counsel time to present his substantial claims of innocence.

Dailey was scheduled to be executed on Nov. 7 for the 1985 murder of 14-year-old Shelly Boggio.
